

## PORTABLE DRYLAND DIVING STAND

### Fact Sheet

- Frame Length without diving board is 14 feet.
- Frame length with diving board is 16 feet. (Diving board NOT supplied)
- Frame Width is 30 inches.
- Frame Height without fulcrum is 30 inches.
- Frame Height with fulcrum and diving board is 41 inches (Fulcrum included only with fulcrum option)
- Frame constructed from 11 gauge tubular steel.
- Frame is painted with red oxide primer to prevent rust. Most users decide to paint the frame to their school or club colors. Rust-o-leum paint is recommended.
- Duraflex Hinges are included with all models.
- Duraflex fulcrum roller, foot wheel, slide tracks and fulcrum assembly are included with fulcrum option.
- Weight is 275 lbs. (non-fulcrum option) and 350 lbs. (fulcrum option)

### Safety and Use Recommendations

- Read and follow all safety instructions included with this equipment.
- Know your limitations and the limitations of the equipment you are using.
- Always use this item under the close supervision of a trained instructor.
- Always follow United States Diving, Inc. safety protocols for use of dryland diving boards and trampolines.
- In order to provide a level surface on which to rest, place Portable Dryland Diving Stand on 1-inch basic mat or use Mondo or Rough-Tex platform surface. (Not included)
- Adjust fulcrum PRIOR to getting on Portable Dryland Diving Board.
- Get on and off of Portable Dryland Diving Stand from the landing pit mat. (Never climb onto diving board directly from pool deck.
- The landing pit mat must meet minimum specification as outlined in The United States Diving Safety Manual. (Minimum dimensions are 12 feet long, 6 feet wide and 32 inches thick)
- Landing pit mat should be level with the tip end of the diving board. This may require pallets or similar item to be placed underneath landing pit to raise the landing pit to diving board level. Pallets should equal the length and width of the landing pit mat so as not to create soft spots in the landing surface.
- The "Lock Down" safety mechanism that is included with your Portable Dryland Diving Stand MUST be placed on board at the conclusion of use and whenever not supervised.
- Follow United States Diving Safety guidelines for skill use and instruction of Dryboard, trampoline and dry platform.
